Remodelling the Sigmund Freud Museum, Vienna: Some Curatorial Considerations

In her talk, Daniela Finzi, presents the conceptual curatorial reflections and decisions as well as the architectural interventions regarding the re-organization of the Sigmund Freud Museum, extensively renovated and expanded in 2020. Different paths through the labyrinthian rooms enable the visitors to trace their former function, meaning and history as well as to experience the material emptiness of rooms that are full of memories. Selected exhibits as well as first editions and books with rare dedications, reflect Freud's psychoanalysis, insights and theoretical developments.
